Chesapeake Children's Museum started with an open community meeting on June 28, 1992. Our mission is to create an environment of discovery about oneself, the peoples, the ecologies, and the technologies of the Chesapeake Bay area for all our children and for the child in us all.		

**11. Description and Purpose of Project** (Limit length to visible area)

The Purpose of the project is to provide wayfinding and education (Road/Street Marker) at the 60th Anniversary of the Civil Rights, of the first Sit-In in Maryland's State Capital - Annapolis. On November 25, 1960, 5 African Americans (3 men 2 women - Annapolis Five) walked into the Terminal Restaurant at the Greyhound Bus Station as asked to be served. They were promptly arrested setting off protests, picketing, and other sit-ins in the City of Annapolis. The current marker is behind a boat-bar and constantly being covered by posters and other promotions.
