A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Prince George's County - Rights of Redemption - Limit on Reimbursement of**
3 **Foreclosure Expenses**
4 **PG 424-96**

5 FOR the purpose of providing that in Prince George's County certain persons are not
6 entitled to be reimbursed for certain expenses in connection with the foreclosure of
7 a right of redemption, that are incurred within a certain period after the tax sale;
8 and providing for the effective date of this Act.

14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

16 **Article - Tax - Property**

17 14-843.

18 (A) [On] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION, ON
19 redemption, the plaintiff or the holder of a certificate of sale is entitled to be reimbursed
20 for expenses incurred in any action or in preparation for any action to foreclose the right
21 of redemption. In addition, the plaintiff or holder of a certificate of sale, on redemption,
22 is entitled to be reimbursed for fees paid for recording the certificate of sale, for
23 attorney's fees in the sum of \$400 for each certificate of sale, for expenses incurred in the
24 publication and service of process by publication, for reasonable fees for a necessary title
25 search, and for taxes, together with interest and penalties on the taxes, arising after the
26 date of sale that have been paid by the plaintiff. The plaintiff or holder of a certificate of
27 sale is not entitled to be reimbursed for any other expenses.

28 (B) IN PRINCE GEORGE'S COUNTY, THE PLAINTIFF OR HOLDER OF A
29 CERTIFICATE OF SALE IS NOT ENTITLED TO BE REIMBURSED FOR EXPENSES
30 INCURRED WITHIN 6 MONTHS AFTER THE DATE OF SALE.

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1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
2 June 1, 1996.
