House Bill 802 (Prince George’s County Delegation)
 Economic Matters Referred to Economic and Environmental Affairs

Prince George’s County - Alcoholic Beverages
(Number of Licenses)
PG 306-96

This amended bill increases the number of certain alcoholic beverages licenses that may be issued in Prince George’s County, as follows:

License	Current Law	Proposed Law	Increase
Class A beer, wine, and liquor	142	144	2
Class B beer, wine, and liquor	164	169	5
Class B beer	17	21	4

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None.

Local Effect: Prince George’s County revenues could increase by \$16,400 in FY 1997 due to application and annual license fees, and by \$8,700 annually thereafter, which reflects only the annual license fees. Expenditures would not be affected.

Fiscal Analysis

Local Revenues: Prince George's County revenues could increase by \$16,400 in fiscal 1997. This increase reflects the annual license fees for the additional licenses and the initial application fees for the licenses. All new licenses are subject to an initial application fee of \$700. The information used in calculating the estimate is presented below.

Class A - beer, wine, and liquor (2 @ \$750)	\$ 1,500
Class B - beer, wine, and liquor (5 @ \$1,200)	6,000
Class B - beer (4 @ \$300)	<u>1,200</u>
Total License Fee Increase	\$8,700
Plus:	
Initial Application Fees (11 @ \$700)	<u>\$7,700</u>
Total Fiscal 1997 Revenue Increase	\$16,400

Out-year revenues would increase by \$8,700 annually reflecting only the annual license fees.
