AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL NO. 252

(First Reading File Bill)

AMENDMENT NO. 1

Strike in its entirety line 2 and substitute "Drug-Related Offenses - Course of Conduct"; and strike beginning with "prohibiting" in line 3 down through "City" in line 6 and substitute "prohibiting a person from engaging in a course of conduct with the purpose of committing certain drug-related offenses; establishing a certain penalty; defining a certain term; and generally relating to engaging in a course of conduct with the purpose of committing drug-related offenses"; and in line 9, strike "286F" and substitute "287C".

AMENDMENT NO. 2

Strike in their entirety lines 15 through 27, inclusive, and substitute:

"287C.

(A) IN THIS SECTION, "COURSE OF CONDUCT" MEANS A PERSISTENT PATTERN OF CONDUCT, COMPOSED OF A SERIES OF ACTS OVER A PERIOD OF TIME, THAT EVIDENCES A CONTINUITY OF PURPOSE.

(B) A PERSON MAY NOT ENGAGE IN A COURSE OF CONDUCT WITH THE PURPOSE OF VIOLATING ANY OF THE PROVISIONS OF §§ 286 THROUGH 290 OF THIS ARTICLE.

(C) A PERSON WHO VIOLATES THIS SECTION IS GUILTY OF A MISDEMEANOR AND ON CONVICTION IS SUBJECT TO A TERM OF IMPRISONMENT NOT EXCEEDING 30 DAYS OR A FINE NOT EXCEEDING \$1,000 OR BOTH."
