A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 Maryland Port Administration Police Officers - Pensions and Retirement

3 FOR the purpose of authorizing certain Maryland Port Administration police officers to
4 become members of the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System; providing for
5 certain exceptions; providing for a delayed effective date; and generally relating to
6 membership of Maryland Port Administration police officers in the Law
7 Enforcement Officers' Pension System.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

20 **Article - State Personnel and Pensions**

21 26-201.

22 (A) [This] EXCEPT AS PROVIDED IN SUBSECTION (B) OF THIS SECTION, THIS
23 subtitle applies only to:

24 (1) an employee of the Department of Natural Resources commissioned by
25 the Secretary of Natural Resources as:

26 (i) a Natural Resources police officer; or

27 (ii) a law enforcement officer, other than a Natural Resources police
28 officer; [or]

1 (2) a law enforcement officer employed by the Maryland Investigative
2 Services Unit; OR

3 (3) A MEMBER OF THE MARYLAND PORT ADMINISTRATION POLICE
4 FORCE WHO HAS THE POWERS GRANTED TO A POLICE OFFICER UNDER § 6-210 OF
5 THE TRANSPORTATION ARTICLE.

6 (B) THIS SUBTITLE DOES NOT APPLY TO A MARYLAND PORT
7 ADMINISTRATION POLICE OFFICER WHO TRANSFERRED FROM THE EMPLOYEES'
8 RETIREMENT SYSTEM TO THE EMPLOYEES' PENSION SYSTEM ON OR AFTER
9 DECEMBER 1, 1996.

11 (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, an individual described in
12 § 26-201 of this subtitle is a member of the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System as
13 a condition of employment.

14 (b) Membership in the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System is optional for
15 an individual described in § 26-201 of this subtitle who was employed:

16 (1) by the Department of Natural Resources on July 1, 1990; [or]

17 (2) by the Maryland Investigative Services Unit on June 30, 1995; OR

18 (3) BY THE MARYLAND PORT ADMINISTRATION ON JUNE 30, 1998.

20 For members who transfer from the Employees' Pension System or the Employees'
21 Retirement System, the Board of Trustees shall transfer to the accumulation fund of the
22 Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System the employer contributions that were made to
23 the Employees' Retirement System and the Employees' Pension System on behalf of
24 those members who transferred, plus the interest earned on those contributions through
25 the date of transfer.

26 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
27 July 1, 1998.
