1 AN ACT concerning

Ethics Law - Use of Prestige of Office

3 FOR the purpose of making applicable to all State officials the provision of the

- 4 Maryland Public Ethics Law that prohibits the intentional use of the prestige of
- 5 office or public position for the official's private gain or that of another, subject to
- 6 an exception for the performance of usual and customary constituent services;
- 7 providing for the application of this Act; generally relating to standards of
- 8 conduct under the Maryland Public Ethics Law; and making this Act an
- 9 emergency measure.

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article - State Government

18 15-506.

19 (a) [A public] AN official or employee may not intentionally use the prestige of 20 office or public position for that [public] official's or employee's private gain or that of 21 another.

(b) The performance of usual and customary constituent services, withoutadditional compensation, is not prohibited under subsection (a) of this section.

1 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall supersede

2 any amendment to § 15-506 of the State Government Article enacted under Chapter

3 (S.B. /H.B.)(9lr0624/9lr0237) of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1999.

4 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency

5 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety,

6 has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members

7 elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from

8 the date it is enacted.
