BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 12 13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 14 **Article - Transportation** 15 21-1104. Except as provided in [paragraph (2)] PARAGRAPHS (2) AND (3) of 16 this subsection, a person may not drive a vehicle with any sign, poster, card, sticker, 17 18 or other nontransparent material on the windshield, side wings, or side or rear 19 windows of the vehicle. 20 (2) This subsection does not apply to: Materials placed on the windshield or rear window, within a 7 21 22 inch square area in the lower corner, or on the side windows of the vehicle to the rear 23 of the driver, if the materials are placed so as not to interfere with the driver's clear 24 view of traffic;

- 6 REQUIRED BY A FEDERAL OR STATE GOVERNMENT AGENCY AND APPROVED BY THE
