- 16 December 31, 2000, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act
- 17 shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
- 18 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an
- 19 emergency measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health
- 20 and safety, has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all of
- 21 the members elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall
- 22 take effect from the date it is enacted. It shall remain effective until December 31,
- 23 2000, and with no further action required by the General Assembly, at the end of
- 24 December 31, 2000, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
