2	Assisted Suicide - Prohibition		
FOR the purpose of prohibiting a person from assisting another person's suicide or suicide attempt; excepting certain medical situations and procedures; allowing certain persons with standing to seek civil or injunctive relief, and reasonable attorney's fees, from a violator of this Act; allowing certain persons with standing to seek certain civil penalties; allowing the relevant licensing board to take administrative action against a violator of this Act; establishing certain penalties for a violation of this Act; making provisions of this Act severable; defining certain terms; and generally relating to assisted suicide.
