- 193 (A) THE BOARD, ON AN AFFIRMATIVE VOTE OF A MAJORITY OF ITS MEMBERS 194 THEN SERVING, MAY DENY, SUSPEND, REVOKE, OR REPRIMAND AN APPLICANT OR
- 195 LICENSEE, OR PLACE A LICENSE ON PROBATION, IF THE APPLICANT HAS
- 196 COMMITTED ANY OF THE ACTS PROSCRIBED IN § 17-313 OF THIS TITLE, SUBJECT TO 197 THE PROVISIONS IN §§ 17-314 AND 17-315 OF THIS TITLE.
- 198 (B) THE BOARD, ON AN AFFIRMATIVE VOTE OF A MAJORITY OF ITS MEMBERS 199 THEN SERVING, AND FOR REASONS THE BOARD MAY CONSIDER SUFFICIENT, MAY:
- 200 (1) REINSTATE A REVOKED LICENSE;
- 201 (2) REDUCE THE PERIOD OF A SUSPENSION OR PROBATION; OR
