Intends to enroll as a full-time student in an academic program

1 (c) A recipient of an award made under this section shall receive the award for 2 each year indicated in which the recipient is eligible if: 3 The recipient signs an agreement at the time of the initial award to: (1) 4 Commence employment in the State within 1 year after (i) 5 completion of undergraduate studies for 1 year for each year that the scholarship was 6 awarded; and 7 Repay the State the amounts awarded under this subtitle and (ii) 8 simple interest equal to the prime rate of interest plus 2 percent calculated from the 9 date of the first payment of the grant award under this subtitle for any portion of the 10 award if the recipient does not: 11 1. Satisfy the degree requirements of the eligible academic 12 program or fulfill other requirements as provided in this subtitle; and 13 Perform the service obligation for 1 year for each year that 14 the recipient has a scholarship awarded under this subtitle; and 15 The service obligation begins after graduation and cannot be fulfilled 16 prior to graduation from an eligible institution. SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 17
