- 3 FOR the purpose of requiring the Secretary of Health and Mental Hygiene to develop
- 4 a Contingency Plan for Biological and Chemical Terrorism; requiring that the
- 5 Plan address certain issues; requiring the Secretary to consult with the National
- 6 Coordinator for Security, Infrastructure, and Counter-terrorism; and generally
- 7 relating to public health and biological and chemical terrorism.
- 8 BY adding to
- 9 Article Health General
- Section 13-1001 to be under the new subtitle "Subtitle 10. Contingency Plan for
- 11 Biological and Chemical Terrorism"
- 12 Annotated Code of Maryland
- 13 (1994 Replacement Volume and 1998 Supplement)
- 14 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 15 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 16 Article Health General
- 17 SUBTITLE 10. CONTINGENCY PLAN FOR BIOLOGICAL AND CHEMICAL TERRORISM.
- 18 13-1001.
- 19 (A) THE SECRETARY SHALL DEVELOP FOR THE STATE A CONTINGENCY PLAN
- 20 FOR BIOLOGICAL AND CHEMICAL TERRORISM.
- 21 (B) IN DEVELOPING THE CONTINGENCY PLAN FOR BIOLOGICAL AND
- 22 CHEMICAL TERRORISM, THE SECRETARY SHALL CONSULT WITH THE NATIONAL
- 23 COORDINATOR FOR SECURITY, INFRASTRUCTURE, AND COUNTER-TERRORISM.
- 24 (C) THE CONTINGENCY PLAN FOR BIOLOGICAL AND CHEMICAL TERRORISM
- 25 SHALL ADDRESS THE FOLLOWING ISSUES:

- 1 (1) PREVENTING, DETECTING, AND MONITORING BIOLOGICAL AND 2 CHEMICAL ATTACKS;
- 3 (2) MANAGING THE CONSEQUENCES OF CHEMICAL AND BIOLOGICAL 4 ATTACKS, INCLUDING THE TREATMENT OF VICTIMS;
- 5 (3) THE NEED TO DEVELOP AN UNDERSTANDING OF THE DISEASE 6 AGENTS OF BIOLOGICAL AND CHEMICAL ATTACKS AND TREATMENT PROTOCOLS;
- 7 (4) INTEGRATING THE STATE'S PUBLIC HEALTH SYSTEM WITH THE 8 FEDERAL PUBLIC HEALTH AND NATIONAL SECURITY SYSTEMS;
- 9 (5) THE AVAILABILITY OF THE APPROPRIATE KIND AND QUANTITY OF 10 PHARMACEUTICALS AND LABORATORY RESOURCES; AND
- 11 (6) THE NEED TO COORDINATE STATE, LOCAL, AND FEDERAL EFFORTS 12 TO DEVELOP CONTINGENCY PLANS FOR BIOLOGICAL AND CHEMICAL TERRORISM.
- 13 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 14 October 1, 1999.
