- SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 10 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 15 <u>Legislative Services.</u>
- 16 SECTION 2.3.6. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
- 17 effect July 1, 1999. It shall remain effective for a period of three years and, at the end
- 18 of June 30, 2002, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act
- 19 shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
