- 12 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 13 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 16 (a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.
- 17 (2) "Preference" includes:
- 18 (i) a percentage preference;
- 19 (ii) an employee residency requirement; or
- 20 (iii) any other provision that favors a resident over a nonresident.
- 21 (3) "Resident bidder" means a bidder whose principal office is located in
- 22 the State.
- 23 (4) "SERVICES" MEANS SERVICES, ARCHITECTURAL SERVICES,
- 24 CONSTRUCTION RELATED SERVICES, ENGINEERING SERVICES, OR ENERGY
- 25 PERFORMANCE CONTRACT SERVICES, ALL AS DEFINED IN § 11-101 OF THIS ARTICLE.

	(b) When a unit uses competitive sealed bidding to award a procurement contract, the unit may give a preference to the resident bidder who submits the lowest responsive bid from a resident bidder if:
4	(1) the resident bidder is a responsible bidder;
5 6	(2) a responsible bidder whose principal office is in another state submits the lowest responsive bid;
