HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

1 A House Joint Resolution concerning

2 Commission on Transportation Investment

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing a Commission on Transportation Investment to
- 4 examine the needs and funding of the transportation system in the State of
- 5 Maryland; providing for the membership of the Commission; providing for
- 6 certain notice procedures for meetings of the Commission; providing for a
- 7 certain report; and generally relating to a Commission to examine the needs and
- 8 funding of the transportation system in the State of Maryland.
- 9 WHEREAS, The transportation system of this State is funded entirely by the
- 10 Transportation Trust Fund which is independent of the General Fund;
- WHEREAS, The largest source of revenue dedicated to the Transportation Trust
- 12 Fund, the motor fuel tax, is not sensitive to inflation, thereby creating a revenue
- 13 shortfall once system preservation and improvement needs begin to outpace
- 14 revenues;
- 15 WHEREAS, An impending revenue shortfall would prevent the State from
- 16 addressing approximately \$400 million in future unmet transportation needs across
- 17 the State; and
- 18 WHEREAS, A comprehensive, long-term solution is necessary to avoid a
- 19 revenue shortfall and ensure that revenues dedicated to the Transportation Trust
- 20 Fund are sufficient to maintain our existing infrastructure and meet the State's
- 21 future unmet transportation needs; and
- WHEREAS, In 1988, the Governor and the Speaker established a
- 23 Transportation Investment Committee to review future transportation needs and
- 24 submit recommendations on ways to maintain a healthy transportation system; and
- 25 WHEREAS, There is a long-term need to continue the work of this Committee;
- 26 now, therefore, be it
- 27 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the
- 28 Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House are requested to
- 29 establish a Commission on Transportation Investment to examine the transportation

- 1 needs of the State, receive input from the public on the potential impact of the
- 2 impending shortfall of revenues dedicated to the Transportation Trust Fund, review
- 3 the current transportation funding system, and make recommendations on:
- 4 (1) The magnitude of system preservation and unmet transportation needs
- 5 that must be funded if the State is to enhance and maintain a viable transportation
- 6 system;
- 7 (2) The appropriate level of funding necessary to support a viable
- 8 transportation system that is within the abilities of the Maryland Department of
- 9 Transportation to administer; and
- 10 (3) The development of a comprehensive, long-term solution that generates
- 11 revenues sufficient to maintain a viable transportation system and meet the
- 12 long-term funding needs of mass transit; and be it further
- 13 RESOLVED, That the Commission on Transportation Investment be composed
- 14 of:
- 15 (1) Six members of the House of Delegates appointed by the Speaker of the
- 16 House, and six members of the Senate of Maryland appointed by the President of the
- 17 Senate:
- 18 (2) The following members appointed by the Governor:
- 19 (a) The Secretary of the Department of Transportation;
- 20 (b) The Secretary of the Department of Budget and Management;
- 21 (c) The Director of the Office of Planning;
- 22 (d) A representative of the Washington Metropolitan Area Transit
- 23 Authority;
- 24 (e) A representative of Marylanders for Efficient and Safe Highways;
- 25 (f) A representative of the trucking industry;
- 26 (g) A representative of an environmental advocacy group; and
- 27 (h) Four members of the public appointed by the Governor; and be it
- 28 further
- 29 RESOLVED, That the Governor shall designate the Chairman of the
- 30 Commission on Transportation Investment after consultation with the President of
- 31 the Senate and Speaker of the House; and be it further
- 32 RESOLVED, That, to the extent practicable, the Governor shall attempt to
- 33 ensure regional, economic, ethnic, and gender diversity on the Commission; and be it
- 34 further

- 1 RESOLVED, That the Commission on Transportation Investment report its
- 2 findings recommendations to the Governor, and as provided in § 2-1246 of the State
- 3 Government Article, to the General Assembly by December 1, 1999; and be it further
- 4 RESOLVED, That staff for the Commission be provided by the Maryland
- 5 Department of Transportation and the Department of Legislative Services; and be it
- 6 further
- 7 RESOLVED, That notice of each meeting of the Commission be made public by
- 8 delivering a copy of the meeting notice to the Legislative Information Officer, Room
- 9 B-6, Department of Legislative Services, Legislative Services Building, 90 State
- 10 Circle, Annapolis, Maryland 21401-1991. During the Interim, the notice should be
- 11 delivered no later than Thursday at 9 a.m. and, during the legislative session,
- 12 Wednesday, at 9 a.m., for inclusion in the weekly Hearing Schedule; and be it further
- 13 RESOLVED, That a copy of this Resolution be forwarded by the Department of
- 14 Legislative Services to the Honorable Parris N. Glendening, Governor of Maryland;
- 15 the Honorable Thomas V. Mike Miller, Jr., President of the Senate of Maryland; and
- 16 the Honorable Casper R. Taylor, Jr., Speaker of the House of Delegates.
