## 2 Annual Motor Vehicle Safety Inspections

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing a Task Force to Study Annual Motor Vehicle Safety
- 4 Inspections; specifying the membership of the Task Force; establishing the
- 5 duties and staffing of the Task Force; and generally relating to the
- 6 establishment of a Task Force to Study Annual Motor Vehicle Safety
- 7 Inspections.
- 8 WHEREAS, Twenty-one states in the eastern United States have annual
- 9 vehicle safety inspections; and
- WHEREAS, Maryland currently has an effective vehicle safety inspection
- 11 program applicable upon the sale or transfer of title;
- 12 WHEREAS, Maryland currently has an effective biennial vehicle emissions
- 13 inspection program; and
- WHEREAS, An annual vehicle safety inspection may be in the best interest of
- 15 the citizens of Maryland; now, therefore, be it
- 16 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the
- 17 Governor is requested to establish a Task Force to Study Annual Motor Vehicle Safety
- 18 Inspections to study whether, and on what conditions, Maryland should adopt a
- 19 program of annual vehicle safety inspections; and be it further
- 20 RESOLVED, That the membership of the Task Force shall consist of:
- 21 (1) A representative of the Maryland State Police, appointed by the
- 22 Secretary of State Police;
- 23 (2) A representative of the WMDA Service Station and Automotive
- 24 Repair Association;
- 25 (3) A representative of the Maryland Automobile Dealers' Association;
- 26 (4) A representative of the Motor Vehicle Administration, appointed by
- 27 the Administrator of the Motor Vehicle Administration;

- 1 (5) A representative of the Department of the Environment, appointed 2 by the Secretary of the Department of the Environment;
- 3 (6) A representative of the Chesapeake Bay Foundation; and
- 4 (7) A person who is involved in and has knowledge about the sale of
- 5 vehicle diagnostic and inspection equipment, appointed by the Administrator of the
- 6 Motor Vehicle Administration; and be it further
- 7 RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall elect one of its members to serve as
- 8 Chairman of the Task Force; and be it further
- 9 RESOLVED, That the Task Force be staffed by personnel from the Department
- 10 of the State Police, and that notice of each meeting of the Task Force be made public
- 11 by delivering a copy of the meeting notice to the Legislative Information Officer, Room
- 12 B-6, Department of Legislative Services, Legislative Services Building, 90 State
- 13 Circle, Annapolis, Maryland 21401-1991. The notice should be delivered no later than
- 14 Tuesday afternoon at 4:00 p.m. for inclusion in the weekly Hearing Schedule; and be
- 15 it further
- RESOLVED, That the Task Force shall report to the Governor and, in
- 17 accordance with § 2-1246 of the State Government Article, to the General Assembly
- 18 by December 1, 1999; and be it further
- 19 RESOLVED, That a copy of this Resolution be forwarded by the Department of
- 20 Legislative Services to the Honorable Parris N. Glendening, Governor of Maryland;
- 21 the Honorable Thomas V. Mike Miller, Jr., President of the Senate of Maryland; and
- 22 the Honorable Casper R. Taylor, Jr., Speaker of the House of Delegates.
