14 (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) of this section, an individual described
15 in § 26-201 of this subtitle is a member of the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension
16 System as a condition of employment.

17 (b) (1) Subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection, membership in the Law
18 Enforcement Officers' Pension System is optional for an individual described in §
19 26-201 of this subtitle:

20 (i) who was employed by the Department of Natural Resources on 21 July 1, 1990 and who elects membership on or before December 31, 1997;

22 (ii) who was employed by the Maryland Investigative Services Unit 23 on June 30, 1995 and who elects membership on or before December 31, 1997;

24 (iii) who was employed by the Maryland Transportation Authority 25 on June 30, 1997 and who elects membership on or before December 31, 1997;

26 (iv) who was employed by the Baltimore City Sheriff's Department 27 on June 30, 1997 and who elects membership on or before December 31, 1997;

28 (v) who was employed by the University of Maryland Police Force 29 on June 30, 1999 and who elects membership on or before December 31, 1999;

30 (vi) who is employed by a participating governmental unit on the 31 effective date of participation on or after July 1, 1999 for that participating

32 government unit and who elects membership within 6 months of the effective date of

33 participation;

(vii) who was employed by the Maryland Port Administration Police
Force and was subsequently transferred to and employed by the Maryland
Transportation Authority Police Force on July 1, 1998 and who elects membership on

37 or before December 31, 1998; [or]

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1 (viii) who was employed by the office of the State Fire Marshal on 2 June 30, 1998 and who elects membership on or before December 31, 1998; OR

3 (IX) WHO WAS EMPLOYED BY THE MORGAN STATE UNIVERSITY
4 POLICE FORCE ON JUNE 30, 1999 AND WHO ELECTS MEMBERSHIP ON OR BEFORE
5 DECEMBER 31, 1999.

6 (2) To elect to be a member of the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension 7 System, an individual shall file a written application with the State Retirement 8 Agency.

9 (3) If an individual does not elect membership during the applicable 10 period specified under paragraph (1) of this subsection, the individual may not 11 become a member of the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System.

(a) For members who transfer from the Employees' Pension System or the
Employees' Retirement System, the Board of Trustees shall transfer to the
accumulation fund of the Law Enforcement Officers' Pension System the employer
contributions that were made to the Employees' Retirement System and the
Employees' Pension System on behalf of those members who transferred, plus the
interest earned on those contributions through the date of transfer.

19 (b) (1) For members who transfer from a local pension system, the local

20 pension system shall transfer to the Board of Trustees the employer contributions

21 that were made to the local pension system on behalf of those members who

22 transferred, plus the interest earned on those contributions through the date of 23 transfer.

(2) The Board of Trustees shall deposit any funds transferred under
paragraph (1) of this subsection in the accumulation fund of the Law Enforcement
Officers' Pension System.

27 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 28 July 1, 1999.

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
