FOR the purpose of making applicable to all State officials the provision of the Maryland Public Ethics Law that prohibits the intentional use of the prestige of office or public position for the official's private gain or that of another, subject to an exception for the performance of usual and customary constituent services; providing for the application of this Act; and generally relating to standards of conduct under the Maryland Public Ethics Law; and making this Act an emergency measure.

15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 1 (b) The performance of usual and customary constituent services, without 2 additional compensation, is not prohibited under subsection (a) of this section.

  3 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall supersede 4 any amendment to § 15-506 of the State Government Article enacted under Chapter 5 \_\_\_\_(S.B.\_\_\_\_/H.B.\_\_\_\_)(9lr0624/9lr0237) of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1999.

  6 SECTION 3. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act is an emergency 7 measure, is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health and safety, 8 has been passed by a yea and nay vote supported by three-fifths of all the members 9 elected to each of the two Houses of the General Assembly, and shall take effect from 10 the date it is enacted.
