- 4 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 5 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 6 Article Labor and Employment
- 7 8-1601.
- 8 (a) In this subtitle the following terms have the meanings indicated.
- 9 (b) "Self-employment assistance activities" means activities approved by the
- 10 Secretary in which an individual participates for the purpose of establishing a
- 11 business and becoming self-employed. Self-employment assistance activities may
- 12 include, but are not limited to, entrepreneurial training, business counseling, and
- 13 technical assistance.
- 14 (c) "Self-employment assistance allowance" means an allowance payable, in
- 15 lieu of regular unemployment insurance benefits, from the unemployment insurance
- 16 trust fund to an individual who meets the requirements of this subtitle.
- 17 (d) "Self-employment assistance program" means a program under which an
- 18 individual who meets the requirements described in § 8-1604 of this subtitle is
- 19 eligible to receive an allowance in lieu of regular unemployment insurance benefits
- 20 for the purpose of assisting that individual in establishing a business and becoming
- 21 self-employed.
- 22 (e) "Regular benefits" means benefits payable to an individual under this title,
- 23 including benefits payable to federal civilian employees and to ex-servicemembers as
- 24 defined in 5 U.S.C. § 8521(a) who are eligible for unemployment insurance benefits
- 25 for ex-servicemembers under 5 U.S.C. § 8521.

- 27 Unless the result would be inconsistent with this subtitle, the provisions of this
- 28 title that apply to claims for or the payment of regular benefits shall apply to
- 29 self-employment assistance allowances.

- 31 (a) The weekly amount of a self-employment assistance allowance payable to
- 32 an individual under this subtitle is equal to the weekly benefit amount for regular
- 33 benefits otherwise payable under this title.

1 8-1604. 2 Self-employment assistance benefits will be payable pursuant to the (a) eligibility requirements of this subtitle. An individual may be paid a self-employment assistance allowance if the (b) 5 individual: is determined eligible to be paid regular unemployment insurance (1) 6 7 benefits except for the requirements described in subsection (c) of this section: 8 is identified by a worker profiling system, as outlined in the Code of (2)9 Maryland Regulations, as an individual likely to exhaust regular unemployment 10 insurance benefits; 11 (3)has filed an application for participation in a self-employment 12 assistance program within 60 days of filing an initial claim for benefits and has 13 provided the information the Secretary may prescribe; 14 has, at the time the application is filed, a balance of regular benefits 15 equal to at least 18 times the individual's weekly benefit amount in the individual's 16 benefit year; 17 has been accepted into a program approved by the Secretary that will 18 provide self-employment assistance activities; 19 (6)is participating in self-employment assistance activities; 20 (7) is actively engaged on a full-time basis in activities, which may 21 include training, relating to establishing a business and becoming self-employed; and 22 (8)has filed a weekly claim for the self-employment assistance 23 allowance and provided the information the Secretary prescribes. 24 A self-employment assistance allowance is payable on the same terms and 25 subject to the same conditions as regular unemployment insurance benefits except 26 that: (1) the requirements of § 8-903 of this title relating to availability for 27 28 work and actively seeking work are not applicable to the individual; the requirements of § 8-1005 of this title relating to refusal to accept 29 30 referrals or offers of suitable work are not applicable to the individual; 31 (3)the provisions of § 8-803(d) of this title concerning subtracting any

- 29 <u>before December 1, 1999 on a proposal to use available alternative sources of funds for</u>
- 30 the self-employment assistance program in the event that the federal government no
- 31 longer provides funding for this program.
