- WHEREAS, The Maryland State Police is the State's lead law enforcement
- 16 organization responsible for enforcing criminal laws, providing safer highways,
- 17 reducing violent crimes, assisting with community policing activities, and leading
- 18 anti-terrorist efforts; and
- 19 WHEREAS, A position with the Maryland State Police is a difficult,
- 20 demanding, and dangerous lifestyle that takes its toll on those who serve to improve
- 21 the quality of life in Maryland; and
- 22 WHEREAS, The law enforcement professionals of the Maryland State Police
- 23 sacrifice personal comfort and a restful family environment to promote public safety;

- 25 WHEREAS, The men and women who serve in the Maryland State Police
- 26 place their lives in jeopardy every day to protect the citizens of this State; and
- 27 WHEREAS, The members of the State Police Retirement System are not
- 28 eligible for Social Security benefits and the State does not pay Social Security taxes

- 30 WHEREAS, Enhanced benefits are necessary to retain and recruit quality and
- 31 committed law enforcement officers to serve the State in a capacity that is critical to
