2 3	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

8	(d) (1) Except as provided in paragraph (2) PARAGRAPHS (2) AND (3) of this subsection, a person may not drive a vehicle with any sign, poster, card, sticker, or other nontransparent material on the windshield, side wings, or side or rear windows of the vehicle.
10	(2) This subsection does not apply to:
13	(i) Materials placed on the windshield or rear window, within a 7 inch square area in the lower corner, or on the side windows of the vehicle to the rear of the driver, if the materials are placed so as not to interfere with the driver's clear view of traffic;
15 16	(ii) Direction, destination, or termini signs on any passenger common carrier motor vehicle; {or}
	(iii) Electronic toll collection tags placed in the windshield of a vehicle in accordance with the regulations of the Maryland Transportation Authority ; OR
22 23	(IV) A STICKER ISSUED FROM <u>BY</u> THE U.S. DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE THAT IDENTIFIES MILITARY PERSONNEL FOR THE PURPOSE OF GAINING ENTRANCE TO ANY MILITARY INSTALLATION AND THAT IS PLACED IN THE TOP CENTER OF THE WINDSHIELD, AS LONG AS THE STICKER SO PLACED DOES NOT INTERFERE WITH THE DRIVER'S CLEAR VIEW OF TRAFFIC.
