## 2 Immunity - State and Local Governments - Year 2000 Litigation

- 3 FOR the purpose of providing that the State or a local government is immune from
- 4 suit and liability for damages arising out of certain date data problems if the
- 5 State or local government has taken certain actions; providing that officials and
- 6 employees of the State or a local government are immune from suit and liability
- for damages arising out of certain date data problems; providing that the
- 8 immunities under this Act are in addition to any immunities or limits on
- 9 liability otherwise available to the State or a local government; defining certain

- 16 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 17 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 20 (A) (1) IN THIS SECTION THE FOLLOWING WORDS HAVE THE MEANINGS
- 21 INDICATED.
- 22 (2) "COMPLIANCE PLAN" MEANS A WRITTEN PLAN TO INVENTORY,
- 23 ASSESS, AND SCHEDULE REPAIRS AND REMEDIATION OF DATE DATA PROBLEMS IN
- 24 INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY SYSTEMS AND PRODUCTS.

- 1 (3) "DATE DATA" MEANS DATA THAT CONTAIN DATES OR TIMES OR 2 BOTH.
- 3 (4) "DATE DATA PROBLEM" MEANS THE FAILURE, MALFUNCTION, OR
- 4 INADEQUACY OF AN INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY SYSTEM OR PRODUCT TO
- 5 RECOGNIZE, PROCESS, DISTINGUISH, INTERPRET, OR ACCEPT CORRECTLY DATE
- 6 DATA.
- 7 (5) "INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY SYSTEM OR PRODUCT" INCLUDES ANY
- 8 SOFTWARE, FIRMWARE, MICROCODE, HARDWARE, EMBEDDED CHIPS, OR OTHER
- 9 SYSTEM OR PRODUCT, OR ANY COMBINATION OF THOSE ITEMS, THAT CREATES,
- 10 READS, WRITES, CALCULATES, COMPARES, SEQUENCES, OR OTHERWISE PROCESSES
- 11 DATE DATA.
- 12 (6) (I) "LOCAL GOVERNMENT" HAS THE MEANING STATED IN § 5-301
- 13 OF THIS TITLE.
- 14 (II) "LOCAL GOVERNMENT" INCLUDES A COUNTY BOARD OF
- 15 EDUCATION AS DEFINED IN § 1-101 OF THE EDUCATION ARTICLE.
- 16 (7) "STATE" MEANS THE STATE OF MARYLAND OR ANY OF ITS UNITS.
- 17 (B) THE STATE OR A LOCAL GOVERNMENT IS IMMUNE FROM SUIT AND
- 18 LIABILITY FOR DAMAGES ARISING OUT OF A DATE DATA PROBLEM IF THE STATE OR
- 19 LOCAL GOVERNMENT HAS:
- 20 (1) PUBLISHED AND MADE AVAILABLE FOR PUBLIC COMMENT A
- 21 COMPLIANCE PLAN;
- 22 (2) BEFORE OCTOBER 1, 1999, ADOPTED A COMPLIANCE PLAN; AND
- 23 (3) BEFORE DECEMBER 31, 1999, CERTIFIED BY THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE
- 24 OFFICER, CHIEF ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER, OR THE DESIGNEE OF EITHER OFFICER,
- 25 THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE COMPLIANCE PLAN.
- 26 (C) AN OFFICIAL OR EMPLOYEE OF THE STATE OR A LOCAL GOVERNMENT IS
- 27 IMMUNE FROM SUIT AND LIABILITY FOR DAMAGES ARISING OUT OF A DATE DATA
- 28 PROBLEM.
- 29 (D) THE IMMUNITIES SET FORTH IN THIS SECTION ARE IN ADDITION TO ANY
- 30 IMMUNITIES OR LIMITS ON LIABILITY OTHERWISE AVAILABLE TO THE STATE OR A
- 31 LOCAL GOVERNMENT.
- 32 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED. That this Act shall take effect
- 33 July 1, 1999.
