18 19	WHEREAS, On November 23, 1998, the Attorneys General and other representatives of 46 states, Puerto Rico, the U.S. Virgin Islands, the Northern Mariana Islands, Guam, and the District of Columbia signed an agreement with the five largest tobacco manufacturers, ending a 4-year legal battle between the states and the industry; and
23	WHEREAS, The historic settlement with the tobacco industry settles all antitrust, consumer protection, common law negligence, statutory, common law, and equitable claims for monetary, restitutionary, equitable and injunctive relief alleged by any of the settling states; and
25	WHEREAS, Over the next 25 years, the states will receive over \$206 billion

WHEREAS, The State of Maryland can expect to receive approximately \$4.5

28 billion from the settlement through the year 2025; now, therefore,

- 16 (3) COLLECT DATA TO DETERMINE HOW OTHER STATES PLAN TO

- 18 (4) STUDY THE ACTUAL IMPACT ON STATE AND LOCAL PROGRAMS THAT
