1 (1997 Replacement Volume and 1998 Supplement) 2 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 3 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: 4 **Article - Education** 5 15-104. It is the public policy of the State that endowment funds of public 6 (a) 7 institutions of higher education and gifts, donations, bequests, private endowments, 8 and private grants received by public institutions of higher education or their governing boards, including any income therefrom: 10 (1) Shall be used in accordance with the wishes of the donors; and 11 (2) May not be used as a substitute for State General Fund 12 appropriations. 13 The public institutions of higher education are encouraged to (b) 14 promote private fundraising by strengthening institutional development activities 15 and by maintaining relationships with affiliated foundations. Affiliated foundations that are independently established for this 16 purpose shall foperate subject to policies adopted by the governing boards and BE 17 18 approved for form and legal sufficiency by the Attorney General. THE PRESIDENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY SYSTEM OF MARYLAND 19 20 CONSTITUENT INSTITUTIONS MAY ESTABLISH CAMPUS-BASED FOUNDATIONS. EACH 21 FOUNDATION NEED NOT BE APPROVED BY THE BOARD OF REGENTS OF THE 22 UNIVERSITY SYSTEM OF MARYLAND BUT SHALL OPERATE SUBJECT TO POLICIES 23 ADOPTED BY THE BOARD OF REGENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY SYSTEM OF MARYLAND 24 IN CONSULTATION WITH THE PRESIDENTS OF THE UNIVERSITY SYSTEM OF 25 MARYLAND CONSTITUENT INSTITUTIONS. 26 AN AFFILIATED FOUNDATION ESTABLISHED AND OPERATED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION MAY NOT BE CONSIDERED AN AGENCY OR INSTRUMENTALITY OF 27 THE STATE OR A UNIT OF THE EXECUTIVE BRANCH FOR ANY PURPOSE. A FINANCIAL OBLIGATION OR LIABILITY OF AN AFFILIATED 29 30 FOUNDATION ESTABLISHED AND OPERATED UNDER THIS SUBSECTION MAY NOT BE 31 CONSIDERED A DEBT OR AN OBLIGATION OF THE STATE OR THE UNIVERSITY 32 SYSTEM OF MARYLAND. 33 [(3)](4)(6) Sections 15-501 through 15-504 of the State Government 34 Article do not bar an official or employee of a public institution of higher education 35 from becoming a director, official, or employee of an independent foundation 36 organized to foster fundraising and provide related services for the benefit of the 37 institution.

- 5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That the Board of Regents of
- 6 the University System of Maryland in consultation with the presidents of the
- 7 University System of Maryland constituent institutions shall report to the General
- 8 Assembly on or before September 1, 1999, in accordance with Section 2 1246 of the
- 9 State Government Article, on a plan to transfer to any foundation established under
- 10 this Act the assets held on behalf of any University System of Maryland constituent
- 11 institution.
- 12 SECTION 3. 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take
- 13 effect July 1, 1999.
