	WHEREAS, Community-based programs serving citizens with developmental and psychiatric disabilities currently employ more than 40,000 direct service employees; and
5 6	WHEREAS, The low entry-level wages these programs are able to pay often require the hiring of staff who do not have the benefit of a college education; and
7 8	WHEREAS, Low salary levels available in these community-based programs contribute to high staff turnover rates; and
9 10	WHEREAS, Community-based programs would benefit from a more stable, educated workforce to ensure that services are of a high quality; and
13	WHEREAS, Tuition assistance incentives for prospective and current staff would increase workforce stability and service quality, enable resources to be used in expanding services, and provide economic opportunities for individuals interested in human service careers; now, therefore,
15 16	SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- TUITION ASSISTANCE FOR EACH STUDENT MAY BE USED OVER A PERIOD OF NO MORE THAN 5 YEARS.

- 5 (A) A STUDENT WHO RECEIVES TUITION ASSISTANCE SHALL BE REQUIRED 6 TO:
- 7 (1) SIGN AN AGREEMENT WITH THE COMMISSION TO PARTICIPATE IN 8 THE PROGRAM;
- 9 (2) PLEDGE TO WORK IN A COMMUNITY-BASED PROGRAM FOR 4,000 10 HOURS OF CONTINUOUS FULL- OR PART-TIME EMPLOYMENT; AND
