- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 21 October June 1, 1999. It shall remain effective for a period of 3 years and, at the end of September 30, 2002 May 31, 2002, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
