SENATE BILL 516 1 (D) MEMBERS OF THE COMMITTEE SHALL BE APPOINTED ON THE BASIS (1) 2 OF DEMONSTRATED ABILITY AND INTEREST CONCERNING ISSUES AFFECTING 3 CHILDREN AND YOUTH. IN MAKING APPOINTMENTS, THE PRESIDENT AND THE SPEAKER 5 SHALL PROVIDE FOR REPRESENTATION FROM: THE COMMITTEES THAT DEAL WITH ISSUES AFFECTING 6 (I) 7 CHILDREN AND YOUTH; AND 8 (II)THE MAJOR AREAS OF THE STATE.
