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(I) EXAMINE DRIVER EDUCATION PROGRAM STANDARDS AND 2 CRITERIA CURRENTLY REQUIRED BY PRIVATE DRIVERS' SCHOOLS LICENSED IN THE 3 STATE; (II)EXAMINE DRIVER EDUCATION PROGRAM STANDARDS AND 5 CRITERIA CURRENTLY REQUIRED BY OTHER STATES; (III)EVALUATE WHAT CAN BE DONE TO IMPROVE PRIVATE DRIVER 6 7 EDUCATION PROGRAMS IN THE STATE; EVALUATE THE FEASIBILITY AND MERITS OF RETURNING (IV) 9 DRIVER'S EDUCATION PROGRAMS TO THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS, INCLUDING: 1. THE LEVEL OF STATE OVERSIGHT REQUIRED; AND 10 11 2. THE COSTS AND DRAWBACKS TO THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS; 12 AND 13 (V) MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS BASED ON ITS EVALUATIONS AND 14 FINDINGS.
