SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION

1 A Senate Joint Resolution concerning

2 State Tobacco Settlement Funds - Medicaid Recoupment

- 3 FOR the purpose of urging the Congress of the United States to enact and the
- 4 President of the United States to support and sign legislation to prohibit the
- 5 federal government from recouping any portion of state tobacco settlement
- 6 funds; and generally relating to Medicaid recoupment.
- WHEREAS, On May 1, 1996, the State of Maryland filed suit in the Circuit
- 8 Court for Baltimore City against a number of manufacturers of tobacco products for
- 9 monetary damages, civil penalties, declaratory and injunctive relief, and restitution;
- 10 and
- 11 WHEREAS, The complaint in Maryland's suit alleged that, over many years, the
- 12 State paid billions of dollars in Medicaid costs to treat smoking-related illnesses; and
- WHEREAS, On November 20, 1998, Maryland joined a national settlement with
- 14 the tobacco industry under which the tobacco industry will pay the states a total of
- 15 \$206 billion to settle all state lawsuits pending against it; and
- WHEREAS, Maryland's share of the settlement is approximately \$4.4 billion;
- 17 and
- WHEREAS, Medicaid is a federal-state entitlement program under which the
- 19 federal government shares in the cost of providing covered services to eligible
- 20 individuals; and
- 21 WHEREAS, The federal Medicaid statute provides that the federal government
- 22 is entitled to a pro rata share of the net amount recovered by a state from liable third
- 23 parties in payment for the amounts the state spent under Medicaid on behalf of
- 24 eligible individuals; and
- 25 WHEREAS, The Health Care Financing Administration, which administers the
- 26 Medicaid program at the federal level, believes that it is authorized and obligated to
- 27 collect its share of any tobacco settlement funds attributable to Medicaid
- 28 expenditures; and

- WHEREAS, The national tobacco settlement was solely attributable to states'
- 2 efforts and was reached without any assistance from the federal government; and
- WHEREAS, Unlike the federal appropriations process, the Constitution of
- 4 Maryland requires the State budget to be balanced each year; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The payments to Maryland under the settlement will be used to
- 6 fund important initiatives and programs; now, therefore, be it
- 7 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the
- 8 General Assembly of Maryland urges the Congress of the United States to enact and
- 9 the President of the United States to support and sign legislation to prohibit the
- 10 federal government from recouping any portion of state tobacco settlement funds; and
- 11 be it further
