Economic Matters

Municipal Corporations - Authority to Regulate the Possession or Consumption of Alcoholic Beverages in Public Places

This bill authorizes the governing body of a municipal corporation to adopt ordinances or resolutions to regulate the possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages in specified "public places" within the municipality's boundaries. Under current law, possession and consumption of alcoholic beverages in public areas is regulated by State and county law.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None.

Local Effect: Municipal expenditures and revenues could increase by a minimal amount. The bill would not directly affect county operations or finances.

Small Business Effect: None.

Fiscal Analysis

Local Effect: Should a municipality enact an ordinance or resolution regulating possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages in public places, expenditures for enforcement could increase. In addition, any monetary penalties that may be established for a violation could increase municipal revenues. Any potential increase in expenditures or revenues cannot be determined at this time but is assumed to be minimal.
