Drivers' Education - Task Force on Driver's Education Programs in Maryland

This bill establishes an 18-member Task Force on Driver's Education Programs in Maryland. The task force must (1) examine driver's education program standards and criteria currently required by private drivers' schools in Maryland and other states; (2) evaluate what can be done to improve private driver's education programs in the State; (3) evaluate the feasibility and merits of returning driver's education programs to the public schools; and (4) make recommendations based on its evaluation and findings. The Motor Vehicle Administration is required to provide staff support. The task force's findings and recommendations are due to the General Assembly by December 31, 1999.

This bill takes effect July 1, 1999 and sunsets April 1, 2000.
