Appropriations

Anthony Gray, Jr. - Compensation for Wrongful Conviction and Wrongful Imprisonment

This bill requires the Governor to include \$7.5 million in the fiscal 2001 State budget to compensate Anthony Gray, Jr. for his wrongful conviction in 1991 and resulting wrongful imprisonment until 1999.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: General fund expenditures would increase by \$7.5 million in FY 2001. Revenues would not be affected.

Local Effect: None.

Small Business Effect: None.

Fiscal Analysis

State Effect: The Governor must include \$7.5 million in the Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services' fiscal 2001 budget authorization to compensate Anthony Gray, Jr. for his wrongful conviction and subsequent imprisonment.

Gray was arrested and convicted in the 1991 murder of a Chesapeake Beach woman. With no legal representation, he confessed to the crime and pleaded guilty to first-degree murder and rape charges and was sentenced to life in prison. In 1999, the Calvert County State's Attorney reopened the case and determined that there was no evidence linking Gray to the crime. According to a news report, physical evidence at the scene indicated that someone else was responsible for the woman's rape and murder. Accordingly, the courts released
