Foster Parents' Bill of Rights of 1999

This bill establishes certain rights of foster parents. These rights include: (1) receiving preservice and ongoing training; (2) receiving timely financial reimbursement; (3) a fair and timely investigation of complaints concerning a parent's licensure; (4) the opportunity to receive mediation or administrative review of decisions affecting licensure; (5) full disclosure from a caseworker about any history and aspects of a child that could affect a foster parent's care; (6) notification of case planning meetings, child placement agency decisions, citizen review board meetings, and court decisions concerning a child in a foster parent's care; (7) consideration as a first source adoptive resource when an adoption plan for a child is developed; and (8) timely access to the appeals process of the child placement agency.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None. The bill's provisions could be handled with existing budgeted resources.

Fiscal Analysis

State Expenditures: Department of Human Resources regulations (COMAR 07.02.25) appear to address many of the bill's requirements. It is assumed that complying with the bill's requirements could be handled with existing budgeted resources by close adherence to current regulations.
