## **Election Law - Voter Registration - Felons**

This bill allows a felon to register to vote, regardless of the number of convictions, provided the sentence imposed for a conviction has been completed, including probation. Under current law, only a felon with 1 conviction may register to vote if the sentence has been completed, including probation.
