## Commission to Study Single-Member Legislative Districting for the House of Delegates of the General Assembly

This joint resolution calls for the creation of an 11-member Commission to Study Single-Member Legislative Districting for the House of Delegates of the General Assembly. The commission, comprised of 6 Delegates and 5 private citizens appointed by the Governor, is to study the feasibility and desirability of proposing a constitutional amendment instituting a system of single-member legislative districts for the House of Delegates. Members may not be compensated, but may be reimbursed for expenses. The Department of Legislative Services will staff the commission. The commission is to report to the Governor and the General Assembly by December 1, 2000.
