Baltimore County - Alcoholic Beverages - Class B (SB) Licenses

This bill extends from September 30, 1999 to September 30, 2004 the sunset date for provisions related to the transfer of licenses into the Pikesville Revitalization Area or Pikesville Town Center in Baltimore County and the conversion of these licenses to Class B (SB) restaurant-service bar licenses. The bill also prohibits the issuance of a Class B (SB) license for use on premises or a location that had an on-sale license within two years prior to the application for a Class B (SB) license.

The bill is effective July 1, 1999.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None.

Local Effect: None. The bill would not increase the number of licenses available in Baltimore County, therefore no additional revenue would be generated from licensing fees. Monitoring of licensees could be handled with existing resources of the board of license commissioners.

Small Business Effect: Potential meaningful impact on small businesses. To the extent that Class B (SB) licenses are obtained through the transfer of licenses from other parts of Baltimore County, small businesses in the Pikesville Revitalization Area or Pikesville Town Center area could be positively impacted.
