House Bill 626 (Delegates Eckardt and Donoghue)

Economic Matters

Medicare Risk Health Maintenance Organizations - Premiums

This bill requires carriers that participate in Medicare HMO risk contracts to offer the same contract in all jurisdictions in the State and to charge the same premium on a Medicare HMO contract regardless of geographic payment area.

The bill takes effect June 1, 1999.

Fiscal Summary

State Effect: None. The bill would not directly affect governmental finances.

Fiscal Analysis

Background: Under existing federal statute, Medicare risk plans are permitted to vary their benefit and premium structure in different geographic areas under the same contract, also known as "flexible benefits." The federal Health Care Financing Administration, however, will designate a state as a single statewide payment area if requested in writing by the governor.
