1 When registered with the Administration every tow truck as defined in (b) 2 this section is a Class T vehicle. 3 (c) A tow truck registered under this section may be used to tow vehicles for 4 repair, storage, or removal from the highway. 5 Subject to the provisions of paragraph (2) of this subsection, for each (d) (1)6 vehicle registered under this section, the annual registration fee is based on the 7 manufacturer's gross vehicle weight rating as follows: Manufacturer's Gross Weight Rating (in Pounds) 8 Fee 9 10,000 (or less) to 26,000 \$100 More than 26,000 \$300 10 (2)(i) The annual registration fee for a vehicle registered under this 11 section that is used for any purpose other than that described in subsection (c) of this section shall be determined under subparagraph (ii) of this paragraph if the 12 13 maximum gross weight of the vehicle or combination of vehicles: 14 Exceeds 18,000 pounds and the vehicle has a 1. 15 manufacturer's gross weight rating of 26,000 pounds or less; or Exceeds 35,000 pounds and the vehicle has a 16 2. manufacturer's gross weight rating of more than 26,000 pounds. 17 18 (ii) The annual registration fee shall be the greater of: 19 1. The fees set forth in § 13-916(b) of this subtitle. 21 Notwithstanding §§ 24-104.1, 24-108, and 24-109 of this article, a tow (e) truck registered under this section, while engaged in a tow, may move a vehicle or 22 vehicle combination on a highway for safety reasons if: 23 The tow truck and the vehicle or vehicle combination being towed 24 (1)25 comply with all applicable statutory weight and size restrictions under Title 24 of this 26 article when measured or weighed separately; and 27 The vehicle or vehicle combination is being towed by the safest and (2)28 shortest practical route possible to the vehicle's destination. 29 (f) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section, while engaged in 30 towing, a tow truck registered under this section is subject to: 31 (1)Weight restrictions imposed on restricted bridges; and

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1 (2) All applicable statutory weight and size restrictions under Title 24 of 2 this article while being operated within the limits of Baltimore City, unless the 3 vehicle is being operated on an interstate highway.

4 (g) Except for tow trucks operated by dealers, automotive dismantlers and 5 recyclers, and scrap processors displaying special registration plates issued under 6 Title 13 of this article, the vehicle shall display a distinctive registration plate as 7 authorized by the Administration.

8 (h) A person who registers a tow truck under this section or operates a tow 9 truck in this State that is registered under the laws of another state shall:

10 (1) Obtain commercial liability insurance in the amount of at least 11 \$100,000 per person, \$300,000 per occurrence bodily injury liability, and \$100,000 per 12 occurrence property damage liability; and

13 (2) Provide a federal employer identification number and, if applicable to 14 the tow truck under federal requirements:

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(i) A U.S. Department of Transportation motor carrier number; or

16(ii)An Interstate Commerce Commission motor carrier authority17 number.

18 (i) (1) Except as provided under paragraph (2) of this subsection, a person
19 may not operate a rollback in combination with a vehicle being towed unless the
20 rollback is registered as a tow truck.

21 (2) This subsection does not apply to a vehicle that is registered and 22 operated in accordance with § 13-621 or § 13-622 of this article.

23 (j) (1) This subsection applies only to a vehicle required to be registered in 24 the State.

25 (2) A person may not operate a tow truck for hire unless the tow truck is 26 registered under this section.

27 (3) (I) A PERSON WHO OPERATES A TOW TRUCK FOR HIRE SHALL 28 ACCEPT FOR PAYMENT OF TOWING CHARGES A CHOICE OF AT LEAST TWO TYPES OF 29 MAJOR CREDIT CARDS OR A DEBIT CARD.

30 (II) ITEM (I) OF THIS PARAGRAPH DOES NOT PRECLUDE A PERSON
31 WHO OPERATES A TOW TRUCK FOR HIRE FROM ACCEPTING OTHER FORMS OF
32 PAYMENT FOR TOWING CHARGES.

33 (4) A person convicted of operating a tow truck in violation of this
34 subsection shall be subject to a fine [of up to] NOT EXCEEDING \$3,000.

35 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 36 October 1, 2000.

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
