A BILL ENTITLED

1 AN ACT concerning

2 **Wicomico County - Alcoholic Beverages - Alcohol Awareness Program**

3 FOR the purpose of requiring that in Wicomico County, if an alcoholic beverages  
4 license holder or a supervisory employee of the license holder is certified by an  
5 approved alcohol awareness program, one or the other must be present on each  
6 licensed premises during the hours in which alcohol may be sold; and generally  
7 relating to licensed premises in Wicomico County.

18 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF  
19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

20 **Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages**

21 13-101.

22 (a) In this section "alcohol awareness program" means a program:

23 (1) That:

24 (i) Is approved and certified by the State Comptroller; and

25 (ii) Has been issued an alcohol awareness program permit by the  
26 State Comptroller;

- 1           (2)     That includes instruction on how alcohol affects a person's:
- 2                   (i)     Body; and
- 3                   (ii)    Behavior;
- 4           (3)     That provides education on the dangers of drinking and driving; and
- 5           (4)     That defines effective methods for:
- 6                   (i)     Serving customers to minimize the chance of intoxication;
- 7                   (ii)    Ceasing service before the customer becomes intoxicated; and
- 8                   (iii)   Determining if a customer is under the drinking age.
- 9     (c)     (1)     A holder of any class of retail alcoholic beverages license or an  
10 employee designated by the holder shall complete training in an approved alcohol  
11 awareness program. The training shall be valid for a period of 4 years, and the holder  
12 shall complete retraining in an approved program for each successive 4-year period.
- 13           (2)     (i)     This paragraph applies only in the following jurisdictions:
- 14                           1.     Howard County; [and]
- 15                           2.     Montgomery County; AND
- 16                           3.     WICOMICO COUNTY.
- 17                   (ii)    The licensee or a person who is employed in a supervisory  
18 capacity designated by the licensee:
- 19                           1.     Shall be certified by an approved alcohol awareness  
20 program; and
- 21                           2.     Except as otherwise provided in subparagraph (iii) of this  
22 paragraph, be present during the hours in which alcohol may be sold.
- 23                   (iii)   1.     In Howard County, the person certified by an approved  
24 alcohol awareness program may be absent from the licensed premises for a bona fide  
25 personal or business reason or an emergency, if the absence lasts for no more than 2  
26 hours.
- 27                           2.     The Board of License Commissioners shall require the  
28 licensee to keep a log book on the licensed premises that contains documentation of  
29 each temporary absence, the length of time of the absence, and the reason for the  
30 absence, in the form required by the Board of License Commissioners.
- 31     (d)     Any licensee who violates the provisions of subsection (c) of this section is  
32 subject to:

1           (1)     For the first offense, a \$100 fine; and

2           (2)     For each subsequent offense, a fine not to exceed \$500 or a  
3 suspension or revocation of the license or both.

4     SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
5 October 1, 2000.
