BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF 18 19 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows: Article 2B - Alcoholic Beverages 20 21 13-101. 22 (a) In this section "alcohol awareness program" means a program: 23 (1)That: 24 (i) Is approved and certified by the State Comptroller; and 25 (ii) Has been issued an alcohol awareness program permit by the 26 State Comptroller;
