- 27 State Scholarship Administration may, with the consent of the Delegate, award the
- 28 unused funds to other eligible recipients throughout the State.
- 29 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 30 July 1, 2000.
