24 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF

25 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

3	(a) (1) In this section the following words have the meanings indicated.						
4 5	(2) "Model type" and "model year" have the meaning stated in § 4064 of the Internal Revenue Code.						
8	(3) "Fuel economy" has the meaning stated in § 4064 of the Internal Revenue Code as determined and adjusted by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency to account for the difference between controlled laboratory conditions and actual road driving.						
	(4) "Passenger car" means a motor vehicle that may be registered as a Class A (passenger) vehicle or registered under § 13-937 of this [article] TITLE as a Class M (multipurpose) vehicle.						
	(b) In conjunction with the tax imposed under § 13-809 of this [article] SUBTITLE, a fuel efficiency surcharge or fuel efficiency credit shall be imposed under this section based on the fuel economy rating of the model type of the passenger car.						
18	(c) (1) (i) Subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection, for new or used passenger cars with a model year of 1993 or 1994, a fuel efficiency surcharge of \$100 shall be imposed on all such passenger cars that have a fuel economy rating that is less than 21 miles per gallon.						
20 21) (ii) 1. This subparagraph does not apply to a passenger car registered under § 13 616 of [the Transportation Article] THIS TITLE.

Subject to paragraph (2) of this subsection, for new or used passenger cars with a model year of 1995 or thereafter, a fuel efficiency surcharge shall be imposed on all such passenger cars that have a fuel economy rating that is less than 27 miles per gallon. The fuel efficiency surcharge shall be an amount equal to the product of multiplying:

30 31 32	(2) The surcharge imposed under paragraph (1) of this subsection may ot exceed an amount equal to 1% of the total purchase price of the passenger car as defined in § 13-809 of this [article] SUBTITLE.						
33 34 35	(3) (i) Subject to paragraph (4) of this subsection, for new or used passenger cars with a model year of 1993 or 1994, a fuel efficiency credit of \$50 shall be granted for all passenger cars that have a fuel economy rating that is greater than

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1 (ii) Subject to paragraph (4) of this subsection, for new or used 2 passenger cars with a model year of 1995 and thereafter, a fuel efficiency credit shall 3 be granted for all passenger cars that have a fuel economy rating that is greater than 4 35 miles per gallon. The fuel efficiency credit shall be an amount equal to the product 5 of multiplying: \$50; and 6 1. 2. 7 The nearest whole number of miles per gallon that the fuel 8 economy rating of the model type of the automobile is greater than 35 miles per 9 gallon. 10 (4)The credit granted under paragraph (3) of this subsection may not 11 exceed an amount equal to 1% of the total purchase price of the passenger car as 12 defined in § 13 809 of this [article] SUBTITLE. 13 (d) The proceeds collected under this section shall be deposited in the 14 Transportation Trust Fund and, to the extent not required by any lawful pledge, covenant, dedication, or commitment for the annual debt service on bonds referred to 15 in § 3 216(e) of this article, shall be disbursed in accordance with this section. 16 17 The proceeds collected from the fuel efficiency surcharge imposed under (e) this section shall be used to fund the fuel efficiency credits granted under this section. 18 All remaining funds shall be used solely for transit purposes. 19 20 A motor vehicle dealer shall prominently display on a vehicle offered for [(f) 21 sale a notice on a form prescribed by the Administration to inform consumers of the 22 fuel efficiency surcharge and fuel efficiency credit program. The notice shall state the 23 provisions of this section applicable to the vehicle and shall be in substantially the 24 following form: 25 26 surcharge is _____ or the fuel efficiency credit is ____ 27 A fuel efficiency surcharge or fuel efficiency credit is required to be applied 28 to purchases of certain passenger cars based on the fuel economy rating of the motor vehicle. The fuel economy rating is determined by a weighted 29 average of the urban and the highway mileage ratings as determined by 30 the Environmental Protection Agency and published in the Environmental 31 Protection Agency's Gas Mileage Guide. 32 33 A fuel efficiency surcharge shall be applied to all passenger cars with a fuel 34 economy rating of less than miles per gallon. The surcharge 35 is (as provided in § 13 818 of the Transportation Article). A fuel 36 efficiency credit shall be applied to all passenger cars with a fuel economy 37 rating of more than _____ miles per gallon. The credit is ___ 38 (as provided in § 13-818 of the Transportation Article). The credit or

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(F) THE ADMINISTRATION, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE STATE
 COMPTROLLER AND REPRESENTATIVE VEHICLE DEALERS, SHALL DEVELOP AND
 IMPLEMENT A CONSUMER INFORMATION PROGRAM FOR THE PURPOSE OF MAKING
 READILY AVAILABLE TO CONSUMERS CONSIDERING THE PURCHASE OF A VEHICLE
 THAT IS SUBJECT TO THIS SECTION INFORMATION CONCERNING THE APPLICATION
 OF THIS SECTION TO THE VEHICLE, INCLUDING NOTICE, AS APPROPRIATE, THAT:

7 (1) A FUEL EFFICIENCY SURCHARGE IS IMPOSED ON THE VEHICLE
8 BECAUSE ITS EXCESSIVE ENERGY USE IS DETRIMENTAL TO ENVIRONMENTAL
9 QUALITY; OR

10(2)A FUEL EFFICIENCY CREDIT IS AVAILABLE FOR THE VEHICLE11BECAUSE ITS EFFICIENT ENERGY USE CONTRIBUTES TO ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY.

12 (g) The Administration may adopt regulations to implement and operate the
 13 fuel efficiency surcharge and credit program AND THE CONSUMER INFORMATION
 14 PROGRAM under this section.

15 (h) Revenue generated under this section is not subject to the distribution
 16 provisions of Title 8, Subtitle 4 of this article.

17 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 18 October 1, 2000.

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
