# 2 **Dredge Material - Alternative Uses - Fund**

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing a Dredge Disposal Alternatives Fund as a special,
- 4 continuing, nonlapsing fund; providing for the purposes and goals of the Fund;
- 5 authorizing the Department of Business and Economic Development to provide
- 6 certain financial assistance from the Fund for certain purposes; directing the

- WHEREAS, The shipping channels for the Port of Baltimore, including the
- 3 main channels and anchorages in and adjacent to the Chesapeake Bay and its
- 4 approaches, must undergo dredging in order to maintain channel depth necessary for
- 5 the economic viability of the Port; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Dredge material has economic value and should be viewed as a

- 16 The reports shall include information on the participation levels in the pilot project
- 17 and Fund, the amount of dredge material processed and reused through the pilot

- 19 potential impact that termination of the Fund and pilot project will have on the
- 20 disposal of dredge materials in the State. The report submitted on July 1, 2002 shall
- 21 also include information on the economic impact on individuals and business entities
- 22 that participated in dredge material reuse projects under this Act.
- 23 SECTION 5. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 24 July 1, 2000. It shall remain effective for a period of 2 years and, at the end of June
- 25 30, 2002, with no further action required by the General Assembly, this Act shall be
- 26 abrogated and of no further force and effect. Any money remaining in the Dredge
- 27 Disposal Alternatives Fund on June 30, 2002, or due to the Dredge Disposal
- 28 Alternatives Fund after June 30, 2002, shall be paid into the General Fund.
