- 14 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

- 17 (a) Except as provided in subsection (c) of this section, a person driving or
- 18 otherwise in charge of a motor vehicle may not leave it unattended until the engine is
- 19 stopped, the ignition locked, the key removed, and the brake effectively set.
- 20 (b) A person driving or otherwise in charge of a motor vehicle may not leave
- 21 the motor vehicle unattended until, if the vehicle is on a grade, the front wheels are
- 22 turned to the curb or side of the highway.
- 23 (c) (1) When a cat or dog is left in the unattended vehicle of an on-duty law
- 24 enforcement officer or an animal control officer, the provisions of subsection (a) of this
- 25 section do not apply to the law enforcement officer or the animal control officer.
- 26 (2) WHEN A VEHICLE IS LOCKED AND ON PRIVATE PROPERTY, THE
- 27 PROVISIONS OF SUBSECTION (A) OF THIS SECTION DO NOT APPLY.

- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 2 October 1, 2000.
