3 FOR the purpose of modifying provisions under the Maryland Vehicle Law relating to the inclusion of photographs on drivers' licenses and identification cards; eliminating a requirement that an applicant for renewal of a driver's license appear in person for each renewal; limiting the number of consecutive license renewals without an individual appearing in person at an office of the Motor Vehicle Administration (MVA); modifying a requirement pertaining to surrender of drivers' licenses; modifying the time period during which the Motor Vehicle Administration (MVA) MVA may renew an expired driver's license without requiring a driving test; modifying a provision concerning renewal of drivers' licenses held by individuals who are absent from the State; making stylistic and technical changes and deleting an obsolete provision; and generally relating to the issuance and renewal of drivers' licenses and identification cards by the MVA under provisions of the Maryland Vehicle Law.
