- 3 FOR the purpose of altering provisions of law providing operational funding to fire
- departments and rescue squads in Charles County to include the Charles 4
- 5 County dive rescue team; requiring the County Commissioners to pay certain
- 6 proceeds of a fire and rescue tax to the dive rescue team under certain
- 7 circumstances; requiring the dive rescue team to use the proceeds for certain
- 8 purposes; authorizing the County Commissioners to distribute certain excess
- 9 proceeds for the formation of new mobile intensive care units and dive rescue
- 10 teams under certain circumstances; requiring the dive rescue team to comply
- with a certain association's standards; authorizing the withholding of certain 11
- 12 funds to the dive rescue team under certain circumstances; authorizing the
- 13 County Commissioners to cease payment of certain funds under certain
- circumstances; prohibiting the use of certain funds for capital expenditures; 14
- 15 requiring the dive rescue team to submit certain information to the Board of
- 16 Fire and Rescue Commissioners; authorizing the Board to require certain
- 17 information from the dive rescue team under certain circumstances; and

- 27 Article 9 - Public Local Laws of Maryland
- (1994 Edition and June 1998 Supplement, as amended) 28
- (As enacted by Chapter 88 of the Acts of the General Assembly of 1999) 29
- 30 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 31 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:

Article 9 - Charles County

- 2 54-1.
- 3 A. The County Commissioners shall levy for each fiscal year a fire and rescue
- 4 tax at the rate of sixteen cents per \$100 of assessed value. The tax shall be levied on
- 5 the assessed value of all taxable real and personal property in Charles County.
- 6 B. [Said] THE fire and rescue tax shall be levied and collected in the same 7 manner as other state and county taxes are now levied and collected.
- 8 C. The proceeds collected from the county fire and rescue tax shall thereafter
- 9 be paid by the County Commissioners twice a year, as determined by the Board of
- 10 Fire and Rescue Commissioners, to all the Fire Departments and rescue squads,
- 11 including mobile intensive care units AND CHARLES COUNTY DIVE RESCUE TEAMS in
- 12 Charles County. The proceeds shall be distributed as directed by the Board of Fire
- 13 and Rescue Commissioners.
- D. The Board of Fire and Rescue Commissioners shall review and make
- 15 recommendations concerning the financing of the fire departments and rescue
- 16 squads, including mobile intensive care units AND CHARLES COUNTY DIVE RESCUE
- 17 TEAMS in Charles County. Distribution of the proceeds of the fire and rescue tax shall
- 18 be to the various fire departments, rescue squads [and], mobile intensive care units
- 19 AND CHARLES COUNTY DIVE RESCUE TEAMS in accordance with a formula agreed on
- 20 by the Board of Fire and Rescue Commissioners and the Executive Committee of the
- 21 Charles County Volunteer Firemen's Association and the executive committee of the
- 22 Charles County Association of Emergency Medical Services. If an agreement cannot
- 23 be reached, the formula employed in the previous year's distribution shall continue in
- 24 use until an agreement is reached. Each sixteen cents received from the fire and
- 25 rescue tax shall be allocated and distributed as follows:
- 26 (1) Ten cents to the various fire departments of Charles County.
- 27 (2) Five cents to the various rescue squads [and], mobile intensive care
- 28 units, AND CHARLES COUNTY DIVE RESCUE TEAMS of Charles County.
- 29 (3) One cent to be used to provide funds to pay for the funded length of 30 service award described in § 54-8 of this chapter.
- 31 E. The funds received by the respective Fire Departments and rescue squads,
- 32 including mobile intensive care units AND CHARLES COUNTY DIVE RESCUE TEAMS,
- 33 from this fire and rescue tax shall be used for the purpose of purchasing, repairing,
- 34 replacing, operating and maintaining their fire-fighting and rescue equipment and
- 35 apparatus and the housing of the [same] FIRE-FIGHTING AND RESCUE EQUIPMENT
- 36 AND APPARATUS and for fire prevention and training. The amount and type of
- 37 equipment and apparatus of [said] THE Fire Departments and rescue squads shall
- 38 conform to the standards prescribed by the Charles County Volunteer Firemen's
- 39 Association and by the Charles County Association of Emergency Medical Services,
- 40 respectively. No resolution, regulation or bylaw shall be passed by [said] THE Fire

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- 1 Departments or rescue squads limiting or restricting the territory within the area
- 2 covered by this fire and rescue tax within which it will respond to emergency calls.
- F. In addition to the fire and rescue tax benefits, the County Commissioners
- 4 of Charles County are authorized to pay out of the general funds of the county
- 5 additional funds to the various Fire Departments and rescue squads as they deem
- 6 necessary. The Board of Fire and Rescue Commissioners shall consider these
- 7 payments in determining the amounts due the various Fire Departments and rescue
- 8 squads under the formula distribution plan and in determining whether excess
- 9 proceeds exist.

10 54-2.

- Excess proceeds, [herein] defined as proceeds from the fire and rescue tax in
- 12 excess of those necessary to satisfy the requirements of the preceding subsections,
- 13 shall, upon recommendation of the Board of Fire and Rescue Commissioners, be used
- 14 by the County Commissioners to reduce the indebtedness of the various Fire
- 15 Departments and rescue squads, to assist in the formation of new Fire Departments
- 16 [or], rescue squads, MOBILE INTENSIVE CARE UNITS AND CHARLES COUNTY DIVE
- 17 RESCUE TEAMS, in accordance with the needs and growth of the county, to allot funds
- 18 to the various Fire Departments and rescue squads to pay for career fire and rescue
- 19 personnel, to support/aid the Southern Maryland Regional Training Center, to hire
- 20 necessary clerical assistance, to accumulate an emergency fund up to a maximum of
- 21 one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000.), to provide assistance to new departments
- 22 [and], squads, MOBILE INTENSIVE CARE UNITS AND CHARLES COUNTY DIVE
- 23 RESCUE TEAMS, or existing departments and squads suffering major losses through
- 24 no fault of their own and/or to pay any part of such excess proceeds to the general
- 25 fund of Charles County as the Board of Fire and Rescue Commissioners deems
- 26 surplus to the needs of the various Fire Departments and rescue squads.

27 54-3.

- 28 A. The Charles County Volunteer Firemen's Association, at least once each
- 29 calendar year, shall conduct an inspection by a duly appointed committee of the
- 30 Association to ascertain whether each department's equipment and apparatus
- 31 complies with the standards of the Association, and the Association, on or before the
- 32 15th of October of each year, shall submit a report, in writing, to the County
- 33 Commissioners and the Board of Fire and Rescue Commissioners stating whether
- 34 each department does or does not meet the standards of the Association. Each
- 35 noncompliance with the standards shall be documented by the Charles County
- 36 Volunteer Firemen's Association.
- 37 B. The Charles County Association of Emergency Medical Services shall, at
- 38 least twice each calendar year, conduct an inspection by a duly appointed committee
- 39 of the Association to ascertain whether each rescue squad's equipment and apparatus,
- 40 including mobile intensive care units AND CHARLES COUNTY DIVE RESCUE TEAMS,
- 41 complies with the standards of the Association. The Association shall, on or before the
- 42 first day of June and December of each year, submit a report, in writing, to the

- 1 County Commissioners and the Board of Fire and Rescue Commissioners stating
- 2 whether each squad meets or fails to meet the standards of the Association.

3 54-4.

- In the event that any one (1) of the Fire Departments, rescue squads [or],
- 5 mobile intensive care units, OR CHARLES COUNTY DIVE RESCUE TEAMS in Charles
- 6 County fails to comply with the standards of its respective Association, then the funds
- 7 proportionate to the noncompliance of the standards may be withheld by the Board of
- 8 Fire and Rescue Commissioners until [said] THE department, squad [or], mobile
- 9 intensive care unit, OR CHARLES COUNTY DIVE RESCUE TEAM has complied with the
- 10 standards of [said] THE Association or has presented an acceptable plan for attaining
- 11 compliance with the standards of [said] THE Association to the Board of Fire and
- 12 Rescue Commissioners. In the event that [said] THE department, squad [or], mobile
- 13 intensive care unit, OR CHARLES COUNTY DIVE RESCUE TEAM does not comply with
- 14 the standards, then the proportionate funds allocated to that department, squad [or],
- 15 mobile intensive care unit, OR CHARLES COUNTY DIVE RESCUE TEAM shall be
- 16 distributed, as necessary, among the companies assuming coverage of that area.

17 54-5.

- In the event that any one (1) of the Fire Departments [or], rescue squads,
- 19 MOBILE INTENSIVE CARE UNIT, OR CHARLES COUNTY DIVE RESCUE TEAMS in
- 20 Charles County ceases to be an active fire-fighting or rescue organization or if the
- 21 funds provided for herein are not used for the purposes set forth in §§ 54-1 and 54-2
- 22 of this Article, the County Commissioners shall cease paying to [that] THE
- 23 department, squad [or] mobile intensive care unit, OR CHARLES COUNTY DIVE
- 24 RESCUE TEAM [such] THE funds, and the [same] FUNDS shall be held and
- 25 distributed, as necessary, on the recommendations of the Board of Fire and Rescue
- 26 Commissioners, to those departments, squads [or], mobile intensive care units, OR
- 27 CHARLES COUNTY DIVE RESCUE TEAMS assuming coverage of [that] THE area;
- 28 provided, further, that the beneficial assets of [said] THE Fire Departments, rescue
- 29 squads [or], mobile intensive care units, OR CHARLES COUNTY DIVE RESCUE TEAMS
- 30 shall become the property of Charles County and that the County Commissioners
- 31 may, at their discretion, assume some or all of the liabilities of [such] THE
- 32 organizations. The County Commissioners may, on the recommendation of the Board
- 33 of Fire and Rescue Commissioners, give [such] THE assets and liabilities to those
- 34 Fire Departments [or], rescue squads, MOBILE INTENSIVE CARE UNITS, OR CHARLES
- 35 COUNTY DIVE RESCUE TEAMS assuming coverage of the area or to any other
- 36 department or squad active in Charles County.

37 54-6.

- 38 A. (1) No department [or], squad, MOBILE INTENSIVE CARE UNIT, OR
- 39 CHARLES COUNTY DIVE RESCUE TEAM receiving benefits under §§ 54-1 and 54-2 of
- 40 this Article shall obligate itself or expend funds for any capital expenditure, including
- 41 the purchase of land, the purchase, erection or modification of any building or
- 42 structure or the acquisition of apparatus, without first obtaining approval of the
- 43 Executive Committee of the Charles County Volunteer Firemen's Association or the

- 1 Charles County Association of Emergency Medical Services and the Board of Fire and 2 Rescue Commissioners. 3 (2) The Board of Fire and Rescue Commissioners shall review each 4 [such] proposal and, in the event that the proposed expenditure exceeds the funds 5 allocated in the formula distribution plan, shall ensure that the organization 6 requesting [such] THE approval is aware of the excess and possesses adequate funds or means to raise [such] THE funds without having a detrimental effect on its 8 fire-fighting or rescue capability or jeopardizing the organization's financial stability. 9 On or before October 1 of each year, each fire department, rescue squad 10 [and], mobile intensive care unit, AND CHARLES COUNTY DIVE RESCUE TEAM to 11 which money is paid by the County Commissioners shall submit to the Board of Fire 12 and Rescue Commissioners and to the County Commissioners a statement prepared 13 by a certified public accountant of all cash receipts and disbursements, regardless of 14 source, for the previous fiscal year and other pertinent information as required by the 15 Board of Fire and Rescue Commissioners. 16 54-7. 17 C. In addition to any other powers that are granted under this chapter, the 18 Board of Fire and Rescue Commissioners may: 19 Swear witnesses and take sworn testimony; (1) 20 Hire a program coordinator, a clerical or administrative assistant, or 21 both, provided that the salary and benefits of the program coordinator and clerical or 22 administrative assistant are paid out of fire and rescue taxes; and 23 (3)After consultation with the County Attorney: 24 Require, as a condition of receiving tax moneys, each County (a) 25 Fire Department and Rescue Squad, including a mobile intensive care unit AND 26 CHARLES COUNTY DIVE RESCUE TEAM, to submit financial records or minutes of 27 meetings to the Board; 28 (b) Remove from office, or bar from office, in any County Fire 29 Department or Rescue Squad, including a mobile intensive care unit AND THE 30 CHARLES COUNTY DIVE RESCUE TEAM, any individual who refuses to submit any 31 record as required under this chapter or otherwise deliberately violates the provisions 32 of this chapter; and 33 (c) Provide for an appeal process for any individual charged with a 34 violation under this [section] CHAPTER.
- 35 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 36 October 1, 2000.
