## HOUSE JOINT RESOLUTION

1 A House Joint Resolution concerning

## 2 Maryland's Legislators Back to School Day

- 3 FOR the purpose of establishing that the Maryland General Assembly supports civic
- 4 education of students by legislators; declaring that the third Friday in
- 5 September shall be designated as Maryland's Legislators Back to School Day;
- 6 and generally relating to legislators and the promotion of civic education.
- WHEREAS, Maryland was created as a representative democracy in which all
- 8 governmental power is inherent in the people who exercise that power through the
- 9 legislative, executive, and judicial branches; and
- WHEREAS, In recent years, citizen interest in government and knowledge of
- 11 the political system declined in part due to a weakening belief in, and a lack of
- 12 understanding of, the virtues and knowledge needed for a successful republican form
- 13 of government; and
- WHEREAS, Benjamin Rush, signer of the Declaration of Independence, stated
- 15 "There is but one method of rendering a republican form of government durable, and
- 16 that is by disseminating the seeds of virtue and knowledge through every part of the
- 17 state by means of proper places and modes of education and this can be done
- 18 effectively only by the aid of the legislature"; and
- WHEREAS, The operations of state legislatures and the roles of individual
- 20 legislators are often little understood by citizens, and that public understanding of
- 21 the institutions and processes of the government is critical to building public trust
- 22 and confidence; and
- 23 WHEREAS, The Maryland General Assembly must foster a better
- 24 understanding of the concept of representative democracy and that education about
- 25 representative democracy should emphasize the importance of compromise and the
- 26 difficulty of resolving competing interests in a diverse society; and
- 27 WHEREAS, Civic education is a vital tool to promote greater understanding of
- 28 the legislative institution and the role of legislators in representative democracy; and
- 29 WHEREAS, Maryland legislators are uniquely qualified to teach students about
- 30 the legislative process and their role in our government; now, therefore, be it

- 1 RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the
- 2 Maryland General Assembly supports civic education to promote greater
- 3 understanding of the legislative institution and the role of legislators in
- 4 representative democracy; and be it further
- 5 RESOLVED, That the Maryland General Assembly declares that the third
- 6 Friday in September shall be designated as Maryland's Legislators Back to School
- 7 Day and urges all members of the legislature to visit schools on that day; and be it
- 8 further
