- 2 Intractable Pain Management Hotline Board of Physician Quality
- 3 Assurance
- 4 FOR the purpose of requiring the Board of Physician Quality Assurance to establish
- 5 and maintain a toll free hotline to receive calls from certain individuals for
- 6 certain purposes; requiring the Board to provide certain types of assistance to
- 7 certain individuals under certain circumstances; requiring the Board to refer
- 8 certain calls to certain other regulatory boards; and generally relating to the
- 9 creation of the Intractable Pain Management Hotline.

- 15 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 16 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 17 Article Health Occupations
- 18 14-509.
- 19 (A) THE BOARD SHALL ESTABLISH AND MAINTAIN A TOLL FREE TELEPHONE
- 20 HOTLINE TO RECEIVE CALLS FROM INDIVIDUALS WHO SUFFER FROM INTRACTABLE
- 21 PAIN AND WHO ARE NOT SATISFIED WITH THE PAIN MANAGEMENT REGIMEN OF
- 22 THEIR LICENSED PHYSICIANS.
- 23 (B) THE BOARD SHALL ASSIST AN INDIVIDUAL WHO SUFFERS FROM
- 24 INTRACTABLE PAIN AND WHO CALLS THE HOTLINE BY DISCUSSING ALTERNATIVE
- 25 PAIN MANAGEMENT REGIMENS WITH THE INDIVIDUAL'S LICENSED PHYSICIAN OR
- 26 BY FACILITATING THE TRANSFER OF THE INDIVIDUAL TO A LICENSED PHYSICIAN
- 27 WITH A PAIN MANAGEMENT REGIMEN THAT IS MORE APPROPRIATE TO THE NEEDS
- 28 OF THE INDIVIDUAL.

- 1 (C) IF THE BOARD RECEIVES A COMPLAINT THAT RELATES TO THE PAIN
- 2 MANAGEMENT REGIMEN OF A PHARMACIST, A NURSE, OR ANOTHER LICENSED
- 3 HEALTH PROFESSIONAL WHO IS NOT A PHYSICIAN, THE BOARD SHALL REFER THE
- 4 CALL TO THE APPROPRIATE LICENSING BOARD.
- 5 SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect
- 6 October 1, 2000.
