- 11 WHEREAS, The nation faces a teacher shortage of 2 million teachers by the
- 12 year 2005, including a shortage in Maryland of 30,000 teachers; and

- WHEREAS, Statistics show that teachers tend to remain in the profession if
- 16 they can be retained beyond 6 years; and
- 17 WHEREAS, 50% of Maryland teachers come from out-of-state; and
- 18 WHEREAS, On any given day 25% of teachers in Maryland schools are
- 19 noncertificated or are teaching out of their field; now, therefore,

- 9 shall be abrogated and of no further force and effect.
