Workers' Compensation - Temporary Total <u>Disability</u> Benefits - Jurisdiction of the Commission	
4 FOR the purpose of expanding the circumstances under which the Workers' 5 Compensation Commission retains jurisdiction pending an appeal to include a 6 request for temporary total <u>disability</u> benefits; and authorizing the Commission, 7 under certain circumstances, to pass a certain supplemental order that an 8 employer provide temporary total benefits pending an appeal; providing that 9 this Act may not be construed to prevent the Commission from ordering a certain 10 offset or credit; providing that the insurer or self-insurer is entitled to a certain 11 offset or credit under certain circumstances; and generally relating to the 12 jurisdiction of the Commission.

- 2 SECTION 1. BE IT ENACTED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF
- 3 MARYLAND, That the Laws of Maryland read as follows:
- 4 Article Labor and Employment
- 5 9-742.
- 6 (a) The Commission retains jurisdiction pending an appeal to consider:
- 7 (1) a request for additional medical treatment and attention; AND
- 8 (2) A REQUEST FOR TEMPORARY TOTAL DISABILITY BENEFITS,
- 9 PROVIDED THAT THE COVERED EMPLOYEE'S TEMPORARY TOTAL DISABILITY
- 10 BENEFITS WERE GRANTED IN THE ORDER ON APPEAL, AND WERE TERMINATED BY
- 11 THE INSURER OR SELF-INSURER PENDING ADJUDICATION OR RESOLUTION OF THE
- 12 APPEAL.
- 13 (b) (1) If the Commission finds that a covered employee needs additional
- 14 medical attention pending an appeal, the Commission may pass a supplemental order
- 15 requiring the employer to provide additional medical treatment and attention.
- 16 (2) IF THE COMMISSION FINDS THAT A COVERED EMPLOYEE NEEDS
- 17 EMPLOYEE'S TEMPORARY TOTAL DISABILITY BENEFITS WERE TERMINATED
- 18 PENDING AN ADJUDICATION OR RESOLUTION OF THE APPEAL, AND THAT THE
- 19 EMPLOYEE WAS TEMPORARILY TOTALLY DISABLED AT THE TIME OF TERMINATION,
- 20 THE COMMISSION MAY PASS A SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER REQUIRING THE EMPLOYER
- 21 TO PROVIDE THE EMPLOYEE WITH TEMPORARY TOTAL DISABILITY BENEFITS.
- 22 (3) IF THE COMMISSION'S DECISION TO REINSTATE TEMPORARY TOTAL
- 23 DISABILITY BENEFITS IS REVERSED OR MODIFIED ON APPEAL, THE INSURER OR
- 24 SELF-INSURER SHALL BE ENTITLED TO AN OFFSET OR CREDIT FOR OVERPAYMENT
- 25 OF THE TEMPORARY TOTAL DISABILITY BENEFITS GRANTED IN THE SUPPLEMENTAL
- 26 ORDER.
- 27 (c) A supplemental order passed by the Commission under this section is
- 28 subject to review on the pending appeal.
- 29 (d) When an appeal that is pending relates solely to a penalty imposed by the
- 30 Commission, the Commission retains jurisdiction over all matters in the case other
- 31 than imposition of the penalty.
- 32 (E) THIS SECTION MAY NOT BE CONSTRUED TO PREVENT THE COMMISSION
- 33 FROM ORDERING AN OFFSET OR CREDIT AGAINST AN AWARD FOR TEMPORARY
- 34 TOTAL OR PERMANENT PARTIAL DISABILITY BENEFITS FOR ANY TEMPORARY TOTAL
- 35 <u>DISABILITY BENEFITS PREVIOUSLY PAID TO A COVERED EMPLOYEE, AS</u>
- 36 AUTHORIZED UNDER ANY OTHER PROVISION OF THIS TITLE.

- SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect 2 October 1, 2000.
